Learning Objective: To be able to understand the importance of a book cover.

Colours

The colours used on a book cover are very important; colours can be used to give a sense of the overall mood of the book or to indicate who the book is aimed at. For example, red might be used to indicate danger, or fear. Blue could be used to indicate that the book was written to appeal to boys.

Images

Subtitles on the left and underlined.



Without giving anything away, the publisher will put images on the front cover to indicate what the story is about. For example, the front cover of *The Hobbit* shows a dragon hoarding his treasure, whilst a small invisible figure is trying to get to the treasure.

For a book:

Author's surname, Initial. (Year of publication in round brackets) *Title of book in italics*. Edition if not the 1st edition. Place of publication: Publisher.

For a book with editors and not a single author (e.g. dictionary, encyclopaedia):

Editor's surname, Initial. (ed.) (Year of publication in round brackets) *Title of book in italics*. Edition if not the 1st edition. Place of publication: Publisher.

Organisational internet site or web page:

Organisational name (Year that the site was published or last updated in round brackets) *Title of website in italics*. Available at: URL (Accessed: date).
