Drama	Students will answer questions from Component 3 – Written Paper, Section A: An Inspector Calls. Answering questions as a performer (4+6 marks), director with design (9 mark) and directing performers (12 marks) based on An Inspector Calls. Ahead of the exam, students will need to revise performance skills i.e. vocal, physical and spatial skills and production elements i.e. lighting, sound, set and costume. Students will also need to practise how to answer the questions, utilising paragraph structures and exemplars. All information will be in their exercise books and Show My Homework.
