Sarah Waters.




We now join 7,500 members enjoying access to over a million books and periodicals, a superb online offering and an unforgettable building in beautiful St James's Square.



Astronomy Club



The school is very lucky to possess virtual reality headsets. This allows pupils and students to learn in a more 'immersed' environment, and do something that they would never normally be able to do. For Astronomy Club, this means going to space! Pupils go aboard the International Space Station, float around in a zero gravity environment, see the different sections of the station, look outside to see Earth 'below' and see how far up the station actually is. They even get to do a spacewalk and go outside the station, all from the safety of a classroom. There are optional pop-ups to be found, whereby they can hold the trigger to reveal text and a photo or sometimes a video. An astronaut will then briefly talk about their experiences. It's an 'unworldly' experience that everyone really enjoys.


Paris Fashion Week Competition


